Medical Direction BOCO House Bill 16-1034	Claudia Kutscher, Deb Hopgood (BCH), Jonathan Greenwald met with Dr. Todd Dorfman 2/4.  The latest wording in Legislative Bill 16-1034 in the House now states a voluntary certification with CDPHE. This sheds new light on how to best deal with assuring that EMR's are current with CE's and covered under Dr. Dorfman's medical direction.  Dr. Dorfman feels the EMR's are of vital importance to the community EMS response. Does not want to place a huge cost and time commitment to continuing to support this level of certification that usually arrive first on scene.  CE requirement will continue to be 12 hours annually with a current CPR certification every 2 years as per AHA.  Agencies under Dr. Dorman will be required to submit a list of all their EMS responders with dates of expiration.  Other Medical Directors may consider this as well.  A general understanding is that EMR's under Division of Fire Prevention and Control may be grandfathered in under CDPHE EMS Division.  All others may voluntarily go through a certification with the state by July 1,2017.
