

Fire Instructor I Course

North Metro Fire Rescue will be hosting a Fire Instructor 1 class on March 8-9, 2018 at 1006 Weld County Road 11. This will be a 16 hour course covering: Role of the Instructor, Safety, Legal Considerations, Psychology of Learning, Public Speaking, and Instructional Delivery (each student will be creating a fire service oriented presentation). The class meets the requirements set forth by the Colorado Division of Fire Prevention and Control, Instructor I level.

Ned Sparks, Division Chief with Loveland Fire Rescue Authority, will be facilitating this course, which meets the training requirements set forth by NFPA 1041 for the Instructor I level.

Students are encouraged to read the IFSTA Fire and Emergency Services Instructor text book prior to class. The class content meets NFPA 1041 Fire Instructor 1 requirements and the student will have an outline for a presentation following class. The student must attend both days to obtain a certificate of completion.

This class <u>does not</u> provide a written or practical test for the State of Colorado, Instructor I certification process. The class will assist the student preparing for the practical test and provides the opportunity to meet other instructors in the emergency service field.
