COURSE DESCRIPTIONS

FI-210: Wildland Fire Origin & Cause Determination: This course is designed to prepare an individual for basic fire investigation responsibilities in the area of origin and cause determination. Students successfully completing this course will receive full credit for FI-210 as required by NWCG certification standards. Prerequisites: Law Enforcement Officer or 1 year experience as a firefighter.

L-280: Followership to Leadership: This training course is designed as a self-assessment opportunity for individuals preparing to step into a leadership role. The course combines one day of classroom instruction followed by a second day in the field with students working through a series of problem-solving events in small teams (Field Leadership Assessment Course). Topics include leadership values and principles, transition challenges for new leaders, situational leadership, team cohesion factors, ethical decision-making, and after-action review techniques. Some course delivery may be arduous in nature. Prerequisites: Experience on incident assignments, L-180, Human Factors in the Wildland Fire Service, successful completion of pre-course work

L-380: Fireline Leadership: This is a leadership development training recommendation for unit supervisors. L-380 is targeted at leaders whose decisions have immediate consequences in dynamic, high-risk environments. The intent is to provide small unit supervisors with the tools to build and maintain effective and cohesive crews/teams. Beyond a set of tools and techniques, this training experience should be designed to make an emotional and lasting impact. Essential guiding principles for achieving this impact include: enhancing the students' understanding of the human dimension when leading others in dynamic work environments; utilizing experiential training techniques that will engage students in ways that challenge them to perform under realistic and high-stress situations; and motivating students to examine their role, strengths, and weaknesses as a leader. Prerequisites: Incident personnel with

supervisory responsibilities, successful completion of L-180, Human Factors in the Wildland Fire Service, satisfactory completion of pre-course work

L-969: NIMS ICS All-Hazards Communications Unit Leader: This course helps participants establish the essential core competencies required for performing the duties of the Communications Unit Leader (COML) in an all-hazards incident. This course addresses all responsibilities appropriate to a COML operating in a local-or state-level All-Hazards Incident Management Team (AHIMT). These responsibilities include the collection, processing, and dissemination as needed to facilitate Operations of Command, General Staff, and Unit Leaders within the confines of a Type 3 AHIMT. Prerequisites: ICS-300: Intermediate ICS for Expanding Incidents; IS-0100.b, Introduction to the ICS, ICS-100; IS-0200.b, ICS for Single Resources and Initial Action Incidents; IS-0700.a, Intro to National Incident Management System; and IS-0800.b, Intro to National Response Framework. Recommended: ICS-400: Advanced ICS for Command & General Staff – Complex Incidents.

S-131: Firefighter Type 1: This course is designed to the meet the needs of an advanced Firefighter Type 1 (FFT1). The course is interactive & contains several tactical decision games designed to facilitate learning the objectives & class discussion. Topics include: fireline reference materials, communications & tactical decision making. Prerequisites: Qualified as FFT2.

S-130/190: Firefighter Training & Intro to Wildland Fire Behavior: This introductory course is designed to train entry-level firefighters referred to as a Firefighter Type 2 (FFT2). You will be introduced to & gain knowledge of the basic incident management organization, firefighting techniques, suppression equipment, safety, strategy/tactics along with fire behavior. Field exercises will be performed for valuable hands-on training. Includes L-180. Prerequisites: None.

S-130-190 Review & Field Day: Firefighter Training: This two-day class assists those students taking the online S-130/190 course with the necessary classroom review & field work to successfully complete the class/field day for NWCG certification. Pre-requisites: successful completion of online S-130/190 modules prior to attendance.

S-200: Initial Attack Incident Commander: This course is designed to meet the training needs of the incident commander type 4 (ICT4). It is presented in a discussion/exercise format. The six instructional units include Foundation Skills; Intelligence Gathering and Documentation; Size Up the Incident; Develop a Plan of Action; Post-fire Activities; Evaluating Incident Objectives and Manage the Incident. Evaluation of the student is by unit tests and performance-based evaluations. Prerequisites: Qualified as any single resource boss & satisfactory completion of pre-course work.

S-211: Portable Pumps & Water Use: This course is designed to provide knowledge and skills to design, setup, operate, troubleshoot, and shut down portable water delivery systems. The focus is on portable pumps – it does not address water delivery for engines. Topics covered include portable water delivery systems; equipment; roles and responsibilities; and system design and hydraulics. There is also a field exercise where students will apply what they learned in the classroom. Prerequisites: None

S-212: Wildland Fire Chainsaws: This class is designed to train students in the proper use of chain saws and techniques necessary to prepare them for their functional role as a chain saw operator on an incident. Class A and B certification is available with this 5-day class & field (based on evaluation). Prerequisites: Qualified as FFT2 and current certification in Basic First Aid & CPR.

S-215: Fire Operations in the Wildland/Urban Interface: This course is designed to assist initial attack incident commanders and company officers in confronting wildland fires that threaten life, property and improvements. Prerequisites: Agency personnel must be Firefighter Type 1 (FFT1) qualified. Structural Fire Department personnel should have completed Intro to ICS(I-100), Human Factors on the Firefighter Training & Intro to Wildland Fire Behavior (S-130/190), and Firefighter Type 1 (S-131); or

equivalent training.

S-219: Firing Operations: This course was developed using a blended approach to learning. Students are required to complete the online training portion of the course prior to taking the ILT. The course introduces the roles and responsibilities of a Firing Boss, Single Resource (FIRB), and outlines duties of other personnel who may engage firing operations. The course discusses and illustrates common firing devices and techniques. Prerequisites: a minimum of FFT2 qualified and RT-130. Students seeking FIRB certification must successfully complete, ICS-200, S-230, S-290 and RT-130.

S-230: Crew Boss This is a classroom course designed to produce student proficiency in the performance of duties associated with the single resource boss position from initial dispatch through demobilization to the home unit. Topics include operational leadership, preparation & mobilization, assignment preparation, risk management, entrapment avoidance, safety & tactics, offline duties, demobilization, & post incident responsibilities. Prerequisites: S-290 & FFT1 qualified.

S-231: Engine Boss: This is a skill course designed to produce student proficiency in the performance of the duties associated with engine boss, single resource (ENGB). Topics include engine & crew capabilities & limitations, information sources, fire size-up considerations, tactics, & wildland/urban interface. Prerequisites: S-230 & FFT1 qualified.

S-270: Basic Air Operations: This course covers aircraft types & capabilities, aviation management & safety for flying in & working with agency aircraft, tactical & logistical uses of aircraft, & requirements for helicopter take-off & landing areas. Note: The regulations, procedures & policies addressed in this course are primarily those governing federal agency & ICS operations. Prerequisites: None.

S-290: Intermediate Fire Behavior: This fire behavior course provides students with the knowledge of wildland fuels & fire behavior to make safe & effective fire management decisions on prescribed & wildland fires. Prerequisites: S-130/190.
