Join the Laboratory to Combat Human Trafficking in collaboration with American Medical Response for a training on how human trafficking is impacting our state and region. This training will explore root causes of trafficking and the myriad of intersecting identities, vulnerabilities, and social and systemic inequalities that can lead to trafficking. Understanding root causes and complex trauma is key to recognizing the crime in its many forms. Learn how the experiences of people with healthcare and mental health needs may intersect with the trafficking experience and how first responders, hospitals and providers can be involved in the response.
