Approval of June 2014 minutes: Motion to approve June 2014 minutes as submitted 1st T Farrell, 2nd G Ball. Motion passed – none opposed.

- 1. Treasurer's Report
 - a. Boulder County Cooperators = \$22,428.22
 - b. Boulder County Firefighters Academy = \$6,415.63

 - a. S-230 Crew Boss (Blended) and S-231 Engine Boss
 - b. S-131 Squad Boss and S-133 Look Up, Look Down, Look Around
 - c. L-280 Followership to Leadership
 - d. ALL-NEW: Boulder County Urban Interface Operations
 - i. Two day course is being developed locally for experienced firefighters, squad bosses and single resource bosses (engine, crew, etc.)
 - ii. Emphasis will be on tactics used when working within the interface, including engine and firing operations, structure triage, structure protection, water supply, etc.

 - a. FFI and FFII schedule is set, and NFPA 1403 class will be added soon
 - b. Teaching HazMat Ops after FFI to maximize burn days in nicer weather
- 4. 2015 Boulder County Grant Request
 - a. Due date was July 31st but BCSO approved a 1-day extension for our meeting
 - b. It was agreed to again seek \$10K as the BCC has done the last three times
 - c. The following 2015 breakdown was approved...
 - i. \$4K for refresher materials, practice shelters, etc.
 - ii. \$4K stipend for RT-130 coordinator
 - iii. \$2K to continue building BCC's equipment cache see attached budget
- 5. 2014 Boulder County Grant/Other Expenditures
 - a. 2014 BoCo Grant Request projected a 12/31/14 balance of \$10K
 - b. \$22,428.22 current BCC cash + est. \$2,600 net income from fall wildland courses = \$25K, so \$15K is still available for remaining 2014 expenditures
 - i. \$5K was funded by BoCo to purchase a second Mark III pump/kit and SnapTank
 - 1. A floating pump was considered but second Mark III was recommended due to the required teaching of series/parallel pumping in S-130/190 and S-211
 - 2. Fol-Da-Tanks were considered but ruled out due to storage/transport difficulties
 - ii. \$3K extra was dedicated to the BCC's equipment cache in 2014 see attached budget
 - \$4K stipend was proposed for the 2014 RT-130 coordinator but further discussion and a vote was postponed until a more widely attended meeting
 - iv. Three \$1K stipends (\$3K) were proposed for the 2014 BCC officers but further discussion and a vote was postponed until a more widely attended meeting
