Floods and Moving Water - April 9-11, 2018

Floods and Moving Water is Dive Rescue International's renowned 24-hour training program for dive teams, water rescue teams, law enforcement officers and fire service personnel. Floods are one of the leading causes of loss of life and property throughout the world. In recent years this type of natural disaster is becoming a more common scenario and communities are demanding their rescue providers be prepared. Due to the potentially enormous scope of a flooding incident, planning is critical to your team's success. Floods can vary in duration and intensity, but many of the concepts for conducting rescue and recovery operations are similar. Prepare for these special hazards by learning how to organize and manage safe floodwater rescue operations.

Prerequisites All students must be a current member of a public safety agency and at least 18 years of age. This program is designed for personnel who are physically fit. Participants are encouraged to participate after successfully completing the IADRS Watermanship Test or testing to a fitness level of 13 MET (Metabolic Equivalents) or greater. Participants with aerobic fitness questions or concerns should consult their physician prior to in-water training. Participants who have poor aerobic fitness may attend this program as surface support personnel with the approval of the instructor.

Be Sure to Bring All students should bring: clothing appropriate for weather conditions, adequate footwear, watersports helmet, and U.S. Coast Guard approved P.F.D. (Type III or V) with whistle and cutting tool, and pen and paper. In-water participants must provide their own wetsuit or swiftwater dry suit, water rescue gloves, work gloves and fins.

Water Operations Officer Development - April 12-13, 2018

The scope of this course is to prepare emergency managers and leaders to operate within the National Incident Management System (NIMS) at a water operation events. This course takes incident command principles and applies them to large and small scale water rescue scenes. Students participate in incident command scenarios and make risk management decisions. Through scenario execution and discussion, students prepare for incidents of various magnitudes where the local NIMS-based ICS may transition to Unified Command. Topics include: Utilizing Incident Management System (IMS) for water rescue, Performing incident assessment at a simulated emergency situation, Creating written incident objectives for water emergency events, Listing strategic and tactical considerations for various emergency situations, Determining management position requirements for water rescue events, Demonstrating the expansion and contraction of IMS, Discussing tactics for large and small-scale events, Demonstrating resource deployment, personnel accountability, logistics management, and implementation of tactics at a simulated rescue event. Entire program will be held in the classroom.

Prerequisites All students must be a current member of a public safety agency and at least 18 years of age.
