A Situational Awareness Matters Tour Stop featuring: Dr. Richard B. Gasaway



Overview: This program shares powerful findings of Dr. Gasaway's extensive research on first responder decision making and situational awareness. In his review of hundreds of near-miss reports, case studies, line-of-duty death reports and videos, he continually found himself being frustrated because there were so many clues, indicators and signs that the incident was going to end in disaster. Yet, for some reason, personnel operating at the incident scene – from company officers to incident commanders – could not see it coming.

In his search to understand why first responders were (seemingly) blind and deaf to what was happening right in front of them, Dr. Gasaway uncovered and investigated over one hundred barriers that can destroy situational awareness.
